The project we will be working on is Jelly Roll Twirl from Fat Quarter Shop. You will need:

1 jelly roll or 33-2 1/2" width of fabric strips

5/8 yard of background. Cut into 48-3 1/2" squares.

If you want, you can get started before the workshop by sewing of the strips. Sew three different fabrics together, making 11 strip sets. You can iron seams open or to one side.
