Cut:

5 dark - 1" x 4" strips

4 light - 1" x 4" strips

- 7 2" squares from a variety of coordinating fabrics for prairie points
- 1 4" x 5" rectangle for the back If you are not very good at making true 1/4" seams, you can make the 1" strips a little wider.



Binding Clip Cushion

Cut:

1680).

- 5 2" x 4" scraps for the tags
- 4 1" x 5" pieces for the in between
- 2 2" x 5" pieces for the start and finish strips
- 1 5" x 5" square for the back

Crushed walnut shells and batting will be provided for filling both projects.
